OVERVIEW

The NSW Councils Sustainable Water Challenge provides an opportunity for each council to showcase local projects and get recognition for the hard work and innovation demonstrated toward sustainability of water.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Projects entered must have been worked on after June 2006, involve improving water sustainability in some way, but do not need to be completed by September 2008.

Project entries will be judged and awards will be given out in the following nine categories:

- Retrofit
- Infill/Brownfield
- Landscaping
- Greenfield
- Planning & Policy
- Commercial & Industrial
- Community Engagement
- Financial Incentives (new in 2008)
- Research Projects (new in 2008)



ALL PROJECTS

A brief project report for judging (max. 3 pages plus pictures, designs etc.) that will be included in the seminar proceedings and published on the WSUD website.

SHORT-LISTED PROJECTS

A very brief presentation (under 10 minutes) will be required at the Seminar.

COST

Entry to the Sustainable Water Challenge is free and open to all councils in NSW.
